

We have here two main divisions (I) on our love and (II) on God's love which establishes ours. We begin with ours because we know God's love via our love experienced.

I. On love Experienced

We begin here (in A.) by putting love in the baldest of lovers' terms, and then (in B.) we take lovers' love as that in terms of which we understand other kinds of love. Then (in C.) we take parental love as an interpretive principle of love.

II. On "God is Love"

The famous saying, "God is love," appears in I John 4:8, but the sentiment of this saying pervades the entire Bible, the love letter from God, for the saying just sums up the entire Bible. The following pages unpack this saying. Upon reading "God is Love," we see three points we must consider: (A) what God's love is, (B) how we can receive it, and (C) some sober sides of love. And then we add our meditations on some Bible passages on love, including the divine one.
